Open Research is research conducted more **transparently**, more **collaboratively** and with more **sharing**. Open Research is more efficient than traditional research as methodologies, tools and results are shared sooner rather than later in a spirit of scientific cooperation. The research around Covid19 has demonstrated the efficacy of this approach and it is why vaccines have been developed in record time. Open Research involves **open access** to publications and data, the use of **open source tools**, engagement with stakeholders and the **involvement of the public** in the research process. However, for this approach to be successful, it requires the willing involvement of all stakeholders. It is intended that the shift to open research will be gradual and well informed. To this end, a draft roadmap document has been produced by Dr. John Donovan (Head of Research) and Yvonne Desmond (Sub-librarian, Digital Services and Research) Action Plan leads for PA1.1 – Open Research detailing out how this cultural shift might be achieved.
